
School Based Apprenticeships and Traineeships

We are very excited to inform our school community that 6 of our senior students are about to be signed up for a school based traineeship with HOPE works to undertake a Certificate II in Horticulture over the year. The students will be paid 7 hours a week and will also undertake theory/activities with their trainers on one day. They will be attending Bass Coast Specialist School to complete the 2 days a week doing grounds maintenance.

We are also working with HOPE works to try and get a Certificate III in Catering Operations which will run here at SGSS in 2022.







Dear Parents and Carers,
COVID UPDATE

The Victorian Government today announced new directions to prevent the spread of the COVID-19.

As a result, in line with the directions issued from Victoria's Chief Health Officer, all Victorian schools will move to a period of remote and flexible provision from Monday 15 February to Wednesday 17 February inclusive.

Schools must continue to provide on-site supervision for students in the following categories:

Children whose parents are considered <u>essential workers as listed</u>, cannot work from home and where no other supervision arrangements can be made, Vulnerable children, including children in out-of-home care,

children deemed by Child Protection and/or Family Services to be at risk of harm and children identified by the school as vulnerable (including via referral from a family violence agency, homelessness or youth justice service or mental health or other health service).

Families are asked to contact the school to see if they meet the criteria for onsite learning. This can be done via email or SMS over the weekend.

Families wishing to have access to mapbook resources are to contact the school on Monday to have them delivered to your door.

School buses will still be running, the same as they were in the first lockdown in March.

No students are to be at school unless they have been approved.

We will be monitoring the school email and SMS messages over the weekend.

There will be minimal staff on site.
