






Brock, Flynn, Tyler, Byron and Wyatt enjoy going over to LPS to play basketball on Thursday. So wonderful having our schools playing together.
















SECOND HAND UNIIFORMS for free

MEX -IT--UP WRAPS

Ingredients:

Spinach and Herb wrap

11/2 tbs of cream cheese

1/4 red capsicum chopped

1/4 yellow capsicum chopped

50grams Roast Beef

1/2 tomato sliced

Spread 1 Garden Spinach & Herb Wrap with 1 1/2 tablespoons cheese spread. Place 1/4 red capsicum, chopped; 1/4 yellow capsicum, chopped; 50g rare roast beef; and 1/2 tomato, sliced, along the centre. Drizzle over 1 tablespoon mild salsa. Roll up to enclose. Cut in half.



SGSS BEHAVIOUR EDUCATION

As a school wide positive behaviour support school, we proactively teach our students our expected behaviours across the school day, in all areas of the school.

They are rewarded with tokens that can be exchanged for prizes from the shelf.

There are times when any one of our students can be having a difficult time and despite all efforts from staff to try and get the student to make a good choice, sometimes they do not and as a result display a behaviour that is so significant that it warrants a rest day. The school attempts to work with our families to ensure that there is minimal disruption to the child's education and when they return, with some restorative practice it is a clean slate.

We are a SAFE school, which means that our school community is entitled to be free from any form of intimidation : physical , emotional and sexual.

We are also a respectful relationships school where we educate our students to treat all people with respect regardless of gender.

There are times when the school, in consultation with families, decides to utilise the support of outside services such as the police, GCASA, psychologists and counsellors to support our students to understand the consequences of their behaviour and it seriousness. It is extremely important for our students to understand that if they exhibit a serious behaviour out in the community, there could be police intervention and even criminal charges.

Emotional dysregulation is a part of many of our students disabilities, however this does not mean that students can not be taught what is right and what is wrong so that they can be respectful embers of our communities.
