Lunch box ideas

Bacon & Noodle Slice

1 cup milk

1 cup frozen peas

5 spring onions, finely sliced

1/2 cup self-raising flour

250g middle bacon, rind removed, finely shredded

4 pkt instant chicken noodles (85g each)

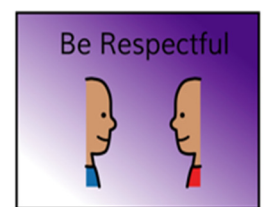
4 cups baby leaf salad mix (to serve)

5 eggs

1 cup tasty cheese, shredded



Preheat oven to 180°C. Grease an 8-cup capacity baking dish. Cook noodles as per packet instructions. Drain well. Heat a frying pan over medium heat. Add bacon and cook for 5 minutes or until golden. Set aside to cool. Whisk eggs and milk together in a large bowl. Add noodles, bacon, onion, peas, flour and cheese to egg mixture. Stir until combined. Transfer to prepared baking dish. Bake for 35 minutes until golden. .
