






Mini Bread Quiches

12 slices of bread (crusts removed)


100g Zucchini, grated coarsely

1/4 cup grated tasty cheddar cheese

2 rashers of Bacon finely chopped

1tbs chopped chives


3 free range eggs, lightly whisked, 1 tbs milk




Combine zucchini, cheese, bacon and chives in a bowl. Divide evenly among the bread cases. Whisk the milk and egg in a jug and pour evenly over the zucchini mixture. Season. Bake for 20—25 minutes or until egg mixture is set. Cool slightly.
