



Respectful relationships at SGSS

A few years back, the Royal Commission into Family Violence discovered just how important schools are in shaping community attitudes, especially attitudes about how we treat one another. Since 2016, schools in Victoria have been teaching their students about what respect and equality mean, why they matter, and how to demonstrate these values. Respectful relationships is one of the main areas of focus in all government schools. So, what does it look like at SGSS? Well, it depends on what class you're in. In the junior classes it might involve understanding the concepts of difference and sameness and helping them see that it's okay to be different. In more senior classes, you could walk into a classroom and see students engaging in discussion about sexual consent and appropriate versus inappropriate interactions with others.

Just like counting and reading, learning about respectful relationships doesn't stop at 3pm when our students leave school for the day – it continues every day in every situation. Whether it's simple chit-chat with the person at your supermarket checkout or a long discussion with a relative over Christmas dinner, your children are watching, listening, and learning. They're working out how adults interact with other adults or children. They're formulating 'scripts' to be social. They're developing their own mental rules for how to treat other people.

So, as part of our commitment to engaging with the broader community on this topic, we encourage you all as parents or carers to take a few moments in the coming week to consider how you can help your child and our great school community reinforce the messages underlying positive and respectful relationships. 500g Sourdough Vienna

125g can creamed corn

1 large zucchini peeled into ribbons

100g English ham torn

1 1/3 cups grated tasty cheese

1 small tomato chopped
